National Championships /

This was a very large National Championships, with paddlers coming from three corners and the middle of the United States. Over \$900 of entry fees was sent in, and five of the events had heats. Of the outstanding paddlers who took home gold medals were M. Sanckishyn, Sebago CC who wen the Juv. K-1 and K-2 then jumped up to the Jr. division and won both the K-2 500 and K-2 5000. Other paddlers who won at least two golds were Ando Toro, Marcia Smoke, Kathy Mosolino, Roland Muhlen, Warren Jurovaty and Lee Plasocki, Barbara Scribner, Jean Cray, Plythe Merritt, Chris Hoermann, Attila Libertiny, Pete Weigand and M. Johnston. The races were held at Lake Sebago, New York with fairly good water conditions and medium headwinds which occasionally switched to the side.



North Americans

The United States was overwhelmed by Canadians in the North American Champioships, Toronto, Aug. 16-17. Although the American women won all three of their events, only one American man stood in first place on the victory stand. However, many of the races were very close with the A ericans frequently being on the losing end of a split decision in addition to being unable to withstand the Canadian depth. Both A erican and Canadian women have improved in regards to depth, which made the races more e citing and meaningful. The men tried hard, but were missing a few of last year's best paddlers who could have helped their effort considerabl .

All the competitors stayed at a Nature School located on the same island as the race course, and were wellfed by their Canadian hosts. The weather was fair, with a meduim strong headwind the first day (500 and 1000 meter events), and rather still the second day. The regatta was well run, with the outstanding feature being the excellent starter. Possible the only sour note of the weekend was the refusal of one of the US men's crews to lend their boat to a US women's crew for the K-4 race which would be 1/2 hour before the men's. While the women were ar fault for not having their boat available, the men certainly did not display a true team sprit. While other US men and women were exchanging boats and moving seats and footrests, four American women who had qualified to race were forced to watch from the sidelines.

Final score of the regatta was Canada 67 - United States 37. When this score is broken down it comes to: American men 18-Canadian men 62; American women 19-Canadian women 5. The point system was 5, 2, 1. US coaches were Gloriane Perrier-women and Ev Merritt-men's C boats and team captain Bill Bragg for the men's K boats.
